- Listen to a presentation
- Discuss in small groups what they heard

Topics include: *Who is Jesus? How to Take Scripture Seriously but not Literally? What is the Kingdom of God?*

- 1) *DOCC Participant Information Sheet* (available from the parish hall or church office);
and
- 2) A \$75 tuition payment (payable to C&HT, with “DOCC” on the memo line)
By Sunday, January 8, 2005.

If you change your mind about the class, the tuition is refundable less a \$15 processing fee.
